Jim is the founder and principal with BDA Landscape Architects and has been involved in over seeing all aspects of the firm since 1975. Jim has had the opportunity of working in many communities across New Brunswick and throughout the Maritime provinces. He has undertaken a great variety of projects including downtown improvement and revitalization plans, waterfront development plans, park and openspace projects, community based tourism plans, and larger scale site plans.

Jim has managed many significant projects involving multiple sub-consultants and client groups. Jim believes in the charette and workshop consultation process to develop a consensus for complex projects. Jim designed the curriculum for a two day course 'What Makes a Sustainable Tourism Destination' for ACOA. He co-delivered the course to 16 communities between 2000-2003. The project won the CLSA National Citation Award.

Jim has been BDA project manager for a number of significant park and open space projects. He was partner in charge of the Bouctouche Dune project, winner of the CSLA Honours Award and the prestigious International Tourism for Tomorrow award. He was lead designer and project manager for the Greenwich Park day use area in Prince Edward Island National Park which was awarded the CSLA National Merit Award and was featured as a Canadian poster in the International Green Building Challenge 2000 in Maastricht Netherlands.

Jim was lead designer and project manager for numerous community and neighborhood projects throughout Atlantic Canada including the recently completed Trout Creek rehabilitation plan in Sussex, Summerside Waterfront Trail and Boardwalk, and several nature parks with boardwalk and wetland trails. Jim has developed an expertise in the routing and detailed design of community and regional trail systems.
